Careers Provision

External motivational speaker workshop provided for Year 11 disadvantaged students to raise aspiration.

All disadvantaged pupils are given one to one career advice through an independent careers advisor students to ensure they were given a clear pathway to further education and career options.

Destination audit was completed by CEIAG Co-Ordinator and any disadvantaged student who did not have a desired destination for Post 16 had a one-to-one independent session to research Post 16 course and completed UCAS progress applications. All disadvantaged students had a post-16 placement on 1 September 2018.

All Year 11 disadvantaged pupils were fully funded to be able to attend the East Regional Careers Show.

All disadvantaged students completed work shadowing placements in Year 10 and were given priority choice of placements at our largest works shadowing partner.

All Year 9 students had a 1:1 Independent Learning Plan interview with the Student Mentor prior to choosing their Year 9 options. All disadvantaged students were seen first to ensure that there is sufficient time for additional guidance, should this be necessary.

Educational Visits

100% of students were provided with an opportunity to access an Educational Visit in the summer term as part of Enrichment Week. Disadvantaged students were financially supported in accessing the visits they wanted to via subsidised costs.

All disadvantaged students were supported to attend / take part in any Enrichment / Educational Event throughout the school year.
